The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities administers apprenticeship programs in Ontario and the Cornwall MTCU office is the local resource for apprenticeship information. For individuals who have acquired a brain injury, finding meaningful employment post-injury can be tremendously difficult. Many individuals are unable to return to their previous employment because physical and/or cognitive impairments prevent them from doing so. As a result, it's necessary to re-evaluate ones skills and abilities when pursuing a new career path.

The goal of this discussion is to introduce the community to Vista Centre Brain Injury Services and to provide insight into the cognitive effects of brain injury and how these impairments can create barriers to re-entering the workforce.

This workshop will give an overview of the Self-Employment Assistance Program (SEA).

The SEA Program consists of a series of short courses designed to assist the new entrepreneur in the assessment of the viability of a business idea and in the development of a complete business plan.

Upon completion of the 8-week in-school component, program participants are eligible for monthly mentoring by successful local business persons who provide guidance and coaching in the critical first months of business operation
